## THE MEDICAL MISSION CONTINUES TO IMPACT LIFE

### PLAIRIMHNE CHARLES LOSES ONE EYE TO SAVE THE OTHER



Madame Charles, a Christian since she was a young child, has been waiting and praying for five years to get relief from a very serious eye disease. It has taken a toll on her health and is threatening the vision in her right eye which aches continuously. God is faithful and he is answering her prayer. She is scheduled to have the eye removed this month. *Please pray that God will provide all of the funds that are needed.*

This past summer Hope for Caribbean kids, Inc. was blessed to lead a medical mission team into Haiti. Many of the people were treated by a doctor and nurses for the first time in their lives.

**If Plairimhne had seen a doctor five years ago it might have made all the difference.** This 40 year-old wife and mother says the problem started five years ago with sores and itching in and around her eye that lasted for eight days. It appears to clear up, but then it came back and she has had problem every since. She is sickly, losing weight and in pain. Her 58 or 60 year-old husband, Choirisin Lestere, is disabled and cannot work. They have two children. She is not sure of their ages because they never had birth certificates. This is common in very poor areas of Haiti where there are no trained individuals to help with child birth. Her youngest child is 13 or 14 and first born child is several years older. She, nor her children have ever attended school. Plairimhne's family struggles to get by. They have very little food due to failed crops. Their home was destroyed by the 2012 hurricane and their current shelter is very poor. Her parents are deceased. However, her four brothers and four sisters live in the area and are also very poor.

**ERISTIN EXCELLENT, PRINCIPAL OF MARE BLANCHE SCHOOL,** is a man of exceptional character and commitment. He has been a member of the Mare Blanche church for thirty years. His father, the late Senior Pastor Exilus Excellent, was the founder of the church and school. In spite of the difficult times the school has faced, this 41-year-old principal has remained for 11 years. One of the most difficult tasks is to keep teachers. Only two of the six teachers who agreed to serve are remaining to teach the 310 students enrolled. The parents are not able to pay the tuition and the pastor had no way to pay them, either. This is why *A child sponsorship program is critically needed.*

**HOW IS THE PRINCIPAL FEEDING HIS FAMILY?**

Principal Excellent is married to Pierre Luciane and has seven children between the ages of 2 to 18. His family life has been difficult and he experiences the same struggles in feeding his family as the rest of the community. He cannot afford to pay tuition for his children, either. The dry season that caused his crops to fail forced him to purchase food on credit.

He has completed an equivalency of 10th grade. The principal, however, has had training that qualifies him to lead. He attended Bible school in Belle-Anse and Port-au-Prince and earned the diploma of an evangelist. Most teachers in that area have an average of a seventh grade education.
