



The Humanitarian Crisis

“Haiti needs international support to tackle an unfolding humanitarian crisis, President Jovenel Moïse said in an interview, two months into anti-government protests that have exacerbated food insecurity in the Americas’ poorest nation.”

“We need international support to get through this crisis.”

More than one-in-three Haitians need urgent assistance to meet their daily food requirements, meaning nearly 3.7 million people, the U.N. World Food Program (WFP) said earlier this month.
