Pastor Wisny is preparing to take another trip to Marre Blanche School. The fall semester has begun. Pastor Wisny, our oversight coordinator who lives 17 hours away in the northern mountains is gearing up to go rescue our kids. **We thank God for Pastor Wisny.** The climate, culture, and conditions in Haiti are more unstable. Political protests, gang violence, ambushes, and the coronavirus continue to be a concern. Nevertheless, the passage to various parts of Haiti requires going through danger. **Please pray for him.**

## **The Broken Road, Then Fixed Road, Is Broken Again!**

Panic set in after learning that the late August hurricane destroyed the only road providing access to Marre Blanche. We started looking for a helicopter to fly in food since their crops were lost. Then a concrete road was installed which allowed food we had purchased to be delivered. A second hurricane hit and destroyed the repaired road. Fortunately, **Pastor Jean Thony, our school director, has a plan** to find enough people with animals to walk the 1 1/2 to 2 hours to the point of the break, load the food and supplies Pastor Wisny will bring, and walk them back to the school. **Please pray that Pastor Wisny will get through safely and be able to complete the task.** The delivery will require several trips. Families are still struggling due to the loss of their crops a second time. The First photo above is a road under construction in early July during Pastor Wisny's last trip there, forcing him to find a dangerous uncharted path that severely damaged the truck. Whether danger on the mountain or danger in the city, Pastor Wisny is willing to take his life in his hands to help our kids and their families.
