## Tragedy Strikes Close to Home.

How do you comfort the hearts of parents who lose their children when their life's purpose is to provide the best for them. And, this happens while they are trying to rescue other children in mortal danger due to anarchy, starvation, and other threats within their own country?

In our August newsletter we introduced Pastor Yaguel Nerat, who started a school in Haiti in 2019 to help kids who were being left out. **On November 30, his two oldest of four children were killed in a motorcycle accident on their way to school.** A third child, his second cousin, was injured, but survived. Some schools in Haiti have just begun to open for the school year.

Pastor Yaguel has been faithfully serving with us since 2009. He uses the money he earns as a school director for New Missions to help support the teachers who are running his school in a very poor area of Haiti. He occasionally gets donations which allow him to provide a meal for what has grown to be 125 children.

Pastor Yaguel and his wife, Carmelite, have two remaining children, Stephen, age 4 and Stephanie, age 3. The two older children, Ismaéla, age 8, and Maxwell, age 7 were killed.

#### Water Crisis Avoided!

In August of 2021 the orphanage was provided a generator which allowed them to have clean water from the well that is on their property. In August of 2022 the generator was stolen. Since that time Pastor Calixte Aladin, orphanage director, has been gathering rain water and transporting water from a community well. However, that well stopped functioning properly. They found themselves in critical need of safe drinking water. In this photo the director is raising his hands in praise for our replacement. To keep it safe, it will be turned off and stored inside daily.
