Ashton Needs a Healing Touch From Jesus.

Ashton was discharged from St. Damien Pediatric Hospital in Port-au-Prince on March 19 after almost 50 days of in-patient care in three medical facilities. A medical scan seemed to show a non-functioning left lung and 50 % capacity in the right lung. Due to conditions in the country, the hospital could not do the surgery. Persistent fevers and vomiting are continuing at this time and more tests and potential remedies are recommended by a different medical clinic.

Air travel to and from Port-au-Prince has been suspended due to gang firing on aircraft and the airport terminal. Once the ban on air travel is lifted, Pastor Wisny will be able to pursue other options to get help for his son.

Pastor Wisny would normally stay with his sister-in-law when in Port-au-Prince, but she, like so many others, has left the city. The Jefferson City News Tribune stated: "More than 33,000 people have fled Haiti's capital, Port-au-Prince, in 13 days" in mid-March. According to Wikipedia the population of Port-au-Prince in 2024 was 3,060,169. Thank you for praying and encouraging others to pray.



Keynote Speaker


